Themed Week

We have really enjoyed our whole school themed week based on Science and Maths in the Locality. The week has been packed with investigations, food tasting, experiments and visitors. Mrs Leyland's class have enjoyed looking at houses in the locality, have painted their own homes and have designed new homes for Winnie and Wilbur. Miss Collins' class conducted a waterproof materials investigation and did a survey of the traffic on Pensby Road which proved to be quite tricky as it was so busy! Mrs Goulding's class also did a Pensby Road traffic survey and managed to squeeze in writing their own Wirral Peninsula brochures as well as an absorbent materials experiment and a shape investigation in Maths.
