Themed Week:

The final week of this half term will see Thingwall celebrate our locality with a science, maths and geography smorgasbord of activities! We plan to base the week around a series of science, maths and geography investigations and we are also welcoming in various exciting visitors. Miss Swinhoe (one of our current Schools Direct Associate Teachers) will deliver two exciting days of science investigations, Freddy Fit will visit us on the Wednesday to help us to understand how we can improve our health and well-being through physical activity, a representative from the RNLI will visit to advise us on water safety (vital as we are surrounded on three sides by water) and we will also introduce the children to the outside improvements we have recently made with Jim Rumble from Acorn to Oaks Forest Schools.

Class Assemblies:

Congratulations to Year Three for an incredible assembly last week. You were really professional and a pleasure to watch. Well done Mrs Mitchell for co-ordinating the whole production with such imagination and flair. Jane Laird from Wirral's Wider Opportunities Music Programme has been working closely with Year Four all year, providing weekly sessions on vocal tuition and recorders. Their assembly will see them perform songs and music linked to the topics they have been studying so far this year.

Thingwall in the Community:

As you will be aware from previous newsletters we continue to enjoy very strong links with the primary schools in our locality. Thingwall is one of a cluster of six local schools who benefit from working very closely together (other schools in the group are Gayton Primary, Barnston Primary, Heswall Primary, Irby Primary and Pensby Primary). Not only do we liaise very closely over our Schools Direct Associate teachers, we also share expertise and drive forward the curriculum in all our schools to ensure the best possible standards for all the children in our care. We thought we would aim to give you an overview of this close collaboration at least once a term. Below is just a snapshot of the work we have done together so far this term...

Science Festival - Thursday 26^a January saw the cluster of schools gather at Heswall Primary for an evening based around the science curriculum with 30 different organisations converging at the school to deliver all manner of practical science investigations around the theme of light, earth and space. My particular favourite was the jumping bean stall which demonstrated how forces can act on an object with quite surprising results! Mrs Holroyd's favourite was the inflatable planetarium. A great evening was had by all and our thanks go to Nicky Bolton who is Heswall's Deputy Head, the Heswall staff (who were shattered after waving good bye to Ofsted only the day before) and the cluster's Science Co-ordinators.

Maths Moderation - January 25th saw all teachers come to Thingwall Primary where we worked in our year groups to moderate a selection of maths books from across the schools to ensure continuity, progression and challenge. Thanks go to Mr Bettridge, our Deputy Head for co-ordinating the evening. We were pleased that Ladymount RC Primary were also able to join us for this valuable session.

Admin Meeting - Last week saw Mrs Hamel gather with the other secretaries at Gayton Primary to discuss our Service Level Agreements and how we can work together to ensure best value with our everyday purchases (paper, toilet rolls etc).

Termly Chairs and Heads meeting - This Friday will see the Chairs of Governors and Head Teachers from all six schools meet at Barnston Primary where we will discuss the progress of our collaborations and ensure we are getting best value for our money which, in the current climate of shrinking school budgets, is a topic that weighs heavily on all our shoulders. Rest assured we will not compromise on the quality of education your child receives, no matter how tight the budgets become in future years.

Foundation Stage Subject Leader meeting - Last Wednesday saw all Subject Leaders visit Irby Primary to discuss resourcing, assessments and good practice in SEND and our Foundation Subjects (History, Geography, Computing, RE, PE, PSHE, Music, Art/DT). Again, this was an excellent session and all six schools agree that we are all learning a lot from each other. Our thanks go to Mrs Palmer, the Head Teacher at Irby Primary for organising such a worthwhile session.

Google Expeditions - Monday 27th February is our first day back after the half term holiday and we are excited to welcome Google Expeditions into school as part of a joint project with Barnston Primary. Exciting details to follow, watch this space...
