#### **Wear Blue for Autism Day:**

The national Wear Blue for Autism day is on Saturday 02.04.16 this year. We have therefore decided to celebrate it a day early so on Friday 01.04.16 we are inviting children to come to school dressed in blue clothing to help raise awareness for ASD and also (if you wish) to raise funds for Autism charities. ### **Building Work - Phase Two:**

We are very pleased that the next phase of our building work is due to start over the Spring Break holidays. North West Construction (in conjunction with Wirral LA) are due to start the refurbishment of the Year Two toilet area on 4.4.16 and they estimate that this will last for approximately six weeks. Therefore the work will not be finished over the break as we had originally hoped so we will need to put several safeguarding measures in place to ensure that the Health and Safety of the pupils, parents and staff are, once again, kept paramount. The LA have worked very closely with school and the governors to ensure that the work is as seamless as possible and of a minimum disruption to all concerned. The side entrance adjacent to Mrs Goulding's room will, once again, be sealed off to allow the workmen to have their own designated entrance and exit area. This means that the walkway from the front playground to the mobiles will be out of bounds for children, staff and all other visitors.

Apologies for any inconvenience this may cause but we know it will be worth it in the end as school is looking fabulous so far (please feel free to pop in and have a look round after 3.30 with your child's class teacher!). The corridor door that opens out onto the Year Two toilets will also be kept locked to prevent any people from accessing the building site. Finally the Stanley School car park will be used to house mess and toilet facilities for the workers. Can you ensure that you do not park in the Stanley School car park for the next six weeks please unless you are picking up/dropping off for CAPE to keep traffic to a minimum. Many thanks for your co-operation, we will get there in the end and the end product will be worth it!
