Obviously this is a very positive report. However, we are always looking to improve further and, as such, we will be focusing on the following areas for the remainder of the year and beyond...

- Maximising opportunities to ensure that <u>all</u> children at school make good progress.
- Getting the balance of homework right.
- Effectively communicating the work of the governing body.
- Finding ways to involve everyone in raising money for the school via the Parent's Association.

Governing Body Report:

It was evident from our recent questionnaire that parents are a little confused about the role of the governing body or what they do in school. It was therefore decided at the last Full Governing Body meeting that I should mention what the various committees do. This would be on a termly basis. Please find below a short synopsis of the work governors have done so far this term:

Full Governing Body

- We welcomed two new governors onto the committees Miss McCormack (Parent Governor, Poppy in Year 5) and Mr Rumble (Community Governor).
- We discussed ways that we can inform parents more effectively about the role that the Governing Body play in school life.
- We discussed the progress we have made with the 5 primary schools in our cluster group Pensby, Irby, Barnston, Gayton and Heswall Primary Schools. In particular we discussed how we have shared good practice, moderation of teaching & learning standards and progress we have made to ensuring best value for resources.
- We shared the responses from the Annual Questionnaire to Parents and Mrs Kenningham (Parent Governor) took the data away to further scrutinise.
- We re-established the committees for 2016/2017 and discussed the need for one more Community Governor to join the group.
- The Head Teacher report to Governors was shared. Highlights were recent outside building works, progress and links with other schools and the community.

Standards and Strategy Committee

- We discussed progress with the targets set in our School Development Plan.
- Governors were informed about our termly Pupil Progress Meetings and the progress of the various classes so far this year.
- We discussed the additional ways we are helping children with their English, Maths and Social & Emotional Health.
- We discussed the impact of expenditure on standards and strategy.

Finance & Staffing

- The Local Authority Bursar (Joanne Hathaway) took governors through the Period 9 financial report and we discussed matters arising from her salient points.
- We discussed how finances are impacted by the additional ways we are helping children with their English, Maths and Social & Emotional Health.
- We discussed our recent Local Authority Financial Audit, the Schools Financial Standards Audit and the certification for the independent annual audit of the School Funds bank account.
- We discussed best value for Service Level Agreements (e.g. Cleaning, Catering, IT, HR, Gardening etc) and ways to move forward to ensure we get best value for our money, especially in the light of the National Funding Formula.
- Formula Capital expenditure and progress against the action points from our recent Ofsted.

Health & Safety

- The Buildings and Site report was presented with prioritised areas for improvement identified.
- The Accident Analysis Report was shared, along with ways that we have refined our processes since the last meeting.
- The progress towards the September 2016 Local Authority Health & Safety inspection was discussed.
- Service Level Agreements were discussed for Cleaning, Gardening, Catering, Safeguarding and Health & Safety.
- Referrals since the last meeting were identified (anonymously). These included referrals to Social Care as well as highlighting any allegations towards staff, for bullying, racism, equality, homophobia, transgender, disability or Team Around the Family meetings.
- Changes to the Local Authority Safeguarding Policy were highlighted.
- We shared an update for the Stanley School/CAPE Pre-School site.

Easter Egg Tombola:

Many thanks to all of you who bought Easter eggs into school, following our recent own clothes day. The lottery tickets are now available, priced at £1.00 per ticket (limited to one ticket per child). We will hold the lottery on Thursday of this week. Therefore the last opportunity to buy a ticket will be Wednesday afternoon. Many thanks to the staff and parents who have organised this exciting event for us, we have been very busy studying the various eggs and selecting our favourites!
