
Welcome to the February edition of our school newsletter and the final one for this half term. The following information may be of interest to you ...

World Book Day:

World Book Day is on Thursday 5th March and, as you know, we usually really enjoy this day and fill it with reading related activities for the children. This year will be no exception and we have decided to encourage children to dress up as their favourite book character or as a character/item from a non-fiction book. Please note, we do understand that not every child enjoys dressing up opportunities so this aspect of the day is purely voluntary.

NB. Year Three will be on their school visit on this day so we have decided to let them dress up on the Friday instead for our visit to Irby Primary to meet Frank Cottrell Boyce.







Break The Rules Day Friday 13th March:

POTS have contacted me regarding concerns from a minority of parents regarding Friday the 13th 'Break the Rules' day. Can we please assure you that this will not be a 'Be Naughty' day – usual codes of conduct, rules and policies will still apply (as will our usual rewards and sanctions systems). There will be a list of 10 specific rules that children will be allowed to break for 50p per rule. Example rules might be wear nail varnish for the day, have a lunchbox treat, spray paint your hair or even dress like a rock star (as several children were disappointed that we changed our original plan to a sponsored walk rather than a Rockathon). There will also be an opportunity for two children to be the Head Teacher and Deputy Head Teacher for the day (we haven't quite finalised those details just yet). 'Break the Rules' days have worked well in many schools and lots of local schools have reported positively about this too. Rules are an important part of any school and, as such, teachers will be using the day to discuss why we have rules, the impact of rules being broken in our classrooms, our schools and on society as a whole and also children will be designing rules for a better world (this ties in with Coast 2 Country 2020 and also will further cement our work on the United Nations 17 Sustainable Goals). We hope that this work will form part of our Unicef Rights and Responsibilities work and set us on our way to becoming a Rights Respecting School. Any children with additional special needs will be fully prepared for this day by class teachers.

Just to reiterate POTS are not planning on this event being a 'Be Naughty' day. School reserves the right to withdraw children whose behaviour is below par from the 'Breaking the Rules' aspect of the day and this will be made clear to everyone before the event. I hope that this clears up any misunderstandings. If anyone has any further queries please do not hesitate to contact the school office.
