The following information may be of interest to you.

Changes to Free School Meals:

Please see the following letter below from Sharon Jones as she has notified us about changes to the Free School Meals entitlement...

Dear Parents

Free School Meals wage threshold eligibility criteria will be introduced from 1 April 2018 for new claims from working parents who also claim Universal Credit (protection is applied to existing claims made up to 31 March 2018)

You may wish to raise awareness with parents and carers who are receiving Universal Credit, that they will presently qualify for Free School Meals for all of their school aged children (provided a claim for this is made)

They will qualify, even if they are working and get Universal Credit in addition to wages at any level.

A wage threshold is to be introduced from 1 April 2018 and anyone who works and successfully applies before 31 March 2018, will get transitional protection so their child(ren) will continue to receive Free School Meals either until 2022 or until their child(ren) finishes their current phase of education, regardless of any increase in their earnings

Wage thresholds for working parents who also get Universal Credit will mean some parents will not qualify if they make a new Free School Meals application after 1 April 2018.

So the big message is **APPLY IMMEDIATELY FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND CERTAINLY BEFORE 31 MARCH 2018.**

Applications can be made in the usual ways

- 1. Via the Wirral Council website www.wirral.gov.uk/free-school-meals (parents should ignore any negative messages they receive from the eligibility auto checker)
- 2. Via a paper form submitted at a One Stop Shop or posted to Benefits Service PO Box 290 Wallasey CH27 9FQ
- 3. Via e-mail to <u>freeschoolmeals@wirral.gov.uk</u> advising full name, address, date of birth, National Insurance number, names of children and schools attended.

Proof of Universal Credit will be required, and the wage threshold figure is calculated using information from up to three Universal Credit past monthly assessment periods. This is to take into account that many parents earn fluctuating amounts each month due to zero hours contracts etc. The regulations pertaining to the administration of the scheme have been altered to implement a net earnings threshold of £7,400 pa from 1 April 2018.
