Parent Survey:

As mentioned in our November newsletter, we had an impressive 145 responses to our recent MAT Parent Survey and your replies scored us at a very strong 'Good' rating, which is pleasing news. As promised, please find a breakdown of the overall responses...

The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved	96% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree 4% rated as disagree/strongly disagree	This is also great news and an improvement on our last survey. We are so pleased that parents have recognised Thingwall's commitment to this vital part of school life as well as recognising that our children are excellent ambassadors for our school. Visitors frequently comment on Thingwall children's good manners and friendly attitudes, in particular the ways that our older pupils help our younger pupils. Thank you!
My child has been bullied and the school has dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.	91% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree9% rated as disagree/strongly disagree	Parents were directed to choose the neutral option if their child had not experienced bullying so this question was judged slightly differently.
My child takes part in clubs and activities at this school	90% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree 10% rated as disagree/strongly disagree	This is good news and an improvement on our last survey. We try to offer a variety of clubs to a variety of ages across the school year and we also try to listen to pupil voice when it comes to selecting new clubs, for example AmaSing, Rock Steady and gymnastics. We are proud to host Wirral Judo and Speare Gymnastics at our school as it means Thingwall pupils can work their way through the sport awards, rather than attending another venue to take sports

		exams/gradings.
School makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year	 87% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree 13% rated as disagree/strongly disagree 	This response is comparatively lower than the other questions. We wondered whether this was due to the fact that the Autumn Term Parents Evening had not yet happened at the point of the survey being sent out. My child does well at school	 96% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree 4% rated as disagree/strongly disagree 	This is great news and we agree with you. Thingwall children work hard in the main, enjoy giving of their best and love to celebrate their own and each other's success at good work assemblies. Now we are using Arbor, it's been great to be able to send the weekly emails home from those assemblies, enabling parents to celebrate in their children's success (on whatever level, as Thingwall celebrates the <i>whole</i> child).
The school lets me know how my child is doing	 89% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree 11% rated as disagree/strongly disagree 	This response is comparatively lower than the other questions. 	3% rated as disagree	responses recognise that we teach the full complement of national curriculum subjects across school, effectively adapting the curriculum to both support and challenge all abilities. We are also very proud that our commitment to the curriculum has been recognised by various quality marks in RE, Science, History and the global curriculum. Thank you!
My child feels safe at this school	99% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree1% rated as disagree	This is fantastic news and lovely to read that 99% feel their children are safe at our school – thank you! We agree with you and our pupil surveys also back this opinion up – they tell us that they feel safe, happy and know who to ask for help if ever things go wrong.
When I have raised concerns with the school, they have been dealt with properly	95% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree5% rated as disagree	This is also good news and we are pleased that the vast majority of responses feel that issues (if any) have been resolved effectively. We enjoy good relationships with our families and we are very pleased that the vast majority agree with this and value our approachable ways.
My child has SEND and the school gives them the support they need to succeed	94% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree6% rated as disagree/strongly disagree	This is a pleasing response and we would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Goulding (school's SENDCo) and Mrs Stacey Evans (MAT's SENDCo) for all their hard work and commitment to ensuring every child reaches their potential, regardless of needs/abilities. Please note that we have no control on the frustrating LA time delays that all schools in Wirral are currently experiencing. <i>NB Parents were directed</i>

		to choose the neutral option if their child does not have SEND.
The school has high expectations for my child	91% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree9% rated as disagree/strongly disagree	This is promising news. Hopefully our previous answers have demonstrated the high expectations and inclusive approach we have for <i>all</i> Thingwall pupils, regardless of ability or additional needs.
The school supports my child's wider personal development	89% rated as neutral, agree or strongly agree 11% rated as disagree/strongly disagree	We feel we do a very good job in this area and visitors/inspections have always agreed with us in this area. We take a pride on focussing on the 'whole child' at Thingwall, rather than purely academic achievements. We will give this question further thought and report back in future newsletters to try to unpick the 11%'s reasons as perhaps we need to inform you in more detail about all the lovely things we do.

It is really heartening to hear the good news stories from past, present and future families! Please continue to spread the good words about our school to the local community as prospective parents often tell us that the word of mouth recommendations make all the difference.

- Children may wear their own clothes for this day but please do remember sensible shoes and a warm coat as it's a very chilly time of the year.
