Williamson Art Gallery Exhibition + Coast 2 Country 2019 Update:

This project continues to go from strength to strength and, I think it is fair to say, ALL of the Deeside Schools are quite rightly proud of this collaboration. Just a reminder the project aimed to...

Collective Deeside Values:

- APPRECIATE the world around us, our role as guardians of this planet, the beauty of our local area.
- *PROTECT* the local environment, the animals around the world who need our help, future generations
- AWARENESS raised across our local communities to enact real and lasting change •RESPONSIBILITY to help meet our global goals, to care for our world, to help the environment
- TOGETHER as a school, as a community, as global citizens.

All 18 schools agreed to take up the following pledges:

Project Legacy Pledges - Deeside Schools pledge ...

1)To take part in the Coast to County project in whatever way they can during the second half of the summer term;

- 2) To have a plastic reduction strategy for their school;
- 3) To select an endangered Wirral plant or animal that is threatened and create a large 3D sculpture for a project exhibition, using plastic found in waste:
- 4) After the project to ask pupils to state what activities and experiences in their local area that every Wirral child should experience e.g. walk on Thurston Beach and submit these for the development of a children's Peninsula Passport;
- 5) To link up with the community and come together on 28th June to clean up!

The Williamson Art Gallery launch for the Coast 2 Country project went really well and Zoey and Grace (both Year Five) represented us brilliantly as part of the Deeside Primary School's Choir. We got to meet environmentalist artist Jacha Potgieter (his similar work is currently being displayed at Chester Cathedral – please take a look over the summer holidays) and Wirral's Mayor! I think it is fair to say the whole Coast 2 Country project has been a tremendous success. Please see the Hilmpact film which shows all the hard work the 18 Deeside schools undertook to make Wirral (and ultimately, we hope, the World) a cleaner, more environmentally-friendly place to live.

All 18 Deeside schools are currently planning Coast 2 country 2020 – we can't wait 'til next year!

Fed Fest:

After a rather soggy start to our Federation Music Concert where we were rained off, Hi-Impact filmed all seven schools' musical contributions last week. We await their finished film with great excitement... if the Coast 2 Country film is anything to go by, we will be in for a great treat. Once the film arrives we will upload it onto the POTS Facebook page, Twitter and our school's VLE.

The POTS Summer Fair was a great event and we were really lucky with the weather, choosing one of the very few Saturdays in June/July to stay dry!
