The children will be taught how to login to Google Classroom and tasks will be fully explained to them when the homework is set. We hope that this method of homework will be more efficient and less paper reliant. If you have any issues completing homework online, please contact your child's teacher, who will be happy to assist.

In FS2, homework tasks will continue to be set through Tapestry. In Year 1, homework will be set on paper. In Year 2, homework will be set on Google Classroom and paper on alternate weeks. If you have any questions about homework provision, please do not hesitate to ask your child's class teacher.


Odd Sock Assembly - Same but Different:
